TWO WINS FOR OUR TECH

In case you missed it: Jendamark's manufacturing technologies have been independently recognised for a second consecutive year by the prestigious Africa Tech Week Awards in Cape Town.

At the ceremony in May, Jendamark won the Technology Innovation of the Year category for our ODIN Manufacturing software, making it two in a row after being named Technology Company of the Year for 2022.

Our innovations director, Yanesh Naidoo, says the award, judged by an independent panel, serves as a confirmation that the manufacturing technology developed by Jendamark is meeting a real need for small to medium enterprises. "For us, it's not about developing technology for technology's sake, but about understanding the customer's challenges, and creating digital solutions to solve those challenges.

"Last year, the award was about our company; this time it's for our products. So, it's a massive win for us," says Yanesh. (continued)

For developing countries such as South Africa and India to prosper, he says, there is a need to focus on building a strong manufacturing-based economy.

"That's why we developed ODIN Manufacturing - to help digitise and improve production efficiencies, and create opportunities for the massive human capital that we have.

"Our solutions take a human-centric. practical approach to Industry 4.0, which means they don't take people off production lines but rather use tech to support people to do their jobs more accurately and efficiently.

"For example, even semi-skilled operators who haven't had much training would be able to handle a complex assembly process just by following ODIN Workstation's step-by-step worker guidance system.

"On the maintenance side, our ODIN Checkpoint app makes it much easier to schedule routine maintenance and service tasks – without reams of paperwork. We even use it to calibrate our own equipment and do daily service checks in the machine shop."














SEAVIEW PRIVATE SANCTUARY IS OPEN!

THE RISE OF WOMEN'S CRICKET

Jendamark United Cricket Club's women's teams are on their way up – from New Brighton to the national stage. Ladies' team manager Khanyisile Majola shares some of the highlights.



or the past seven seasons, Jendamark has partnered with the community-based United Cricket Club, building a world-class development structure that promotes a love of the game among all ages, races and genders.

It was in the 2017/18 season that Cricket South Africa awarded JUCC the honour of hosting one of four cricket development hubs in the Nelson Mandela Bay region.

As a hub, JUCC's programmes not only boost the development of the sport among schoolchildren but also put the women's game on an upward trajectory.

Through healthy engagement in sport, which promotes mental and physical wellness, the club aims to uplift the New Brighton community, and alleviate social issues such as crime, alcohol and drug abuse, and violence against women and children.

As women's team member Siyanda Tyesi shares: "Playing cricket not only changed my life, but it also saved my life."

Currently, our ladies' division comprises players ranging in age from 14 to 40, with three hub teams (U13, u16 and U19) and two senior women's teams. JUCC is represented at provincial level by six senior players, an assistant coach, two committee members and 19 players in the U16 and U19 teams.

Provincial champs

In October 2022, the first team triumphed in the Eastern Province Cricket Women's T20 Competition, beating their second team sisters in an all-JUCC final. The champions followed up with a 10-wicket victory in the regional championships against Kei in East London, booking their ticket to play in the first-ever CSA T20 Women's National Championships in Potchefstroom.

There they represented the club with pride and moved into fourth place in the national T20 rankings, with four players making the top 15 bowling and batting rankings for the tournament.

"It was such an eye-opening experience for our ladies to take part and see the standard of cricket being played throughout South Africa," says women's team manager Khanyisile Majola.

"Next season, we will be back to prove that we are indeed worthy competitors, and to contend against national stars, by preparing well in the pre-season and working hard throughout the season." The first and second team ladies wrapped up a dominating local season, jointly winning the EP Women's League for a second consecutive year. They were also named team of the year for a third straight season.

"All these accolades for a township team from New Brighton is no mean feat. We would like to applaud our ladies for the growth and success they have been able to attain in the five seasons of existence," says Khanyisile.

Star players

Noxolo Peyi, who has been a member of the team since its inception, says the junior players are privileged to grow with the club. "They get to experience all that I ever dreamed of in cricket. This season has been unmatched. I never thought I would play in a national competition; now I can say I have at the age of 36, and was ranked in the top 15 bowlers."

One of the standout products of the hub is club captain and EP senior team member, Aphilile Adonis, who was also voted JUCC sportswoman of the year, players' player of the year, and bowler of the season.

"A girl who never played the game or dreamed of playing, she was coached through our programmes by Zuko Rhonyile and has fulfilled her talent," says Khanyisile.

The players also rubbed shoulders with international cricketing role models when the England women's national team ran a coaching clinic for the hub at the New Brighton Oval.

"It's an experience our boys and girls still speak of today, and will remember for a lifetime," says Khanyisile.

In addition, the girls were invited to be the flag bearers at the T20 World Cup match between India and Ireland at St George's Park.

"We are aware that we are among very few who have the luxury of a sponsorship of this magnitude, if not the only club in the country. We are privileged to be associated with a global company that cares about community upliftment and strives for excellence in all they do."


